2356 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Andy Richards declared an interest in the following items 13 Retendering Parish Council contracts, 19 Council's response to notification of landowners intent to access A4136 via parish land, 20 To consider tenders for the Meend contract. Andy Richards also declared that he holds the contract for the Snow Plough for Staunton Coleford PC.

2358 MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 13th NOVEMBER 2018 It was resolved to confirm the minutes as an accurate record.

2359 ROAD SAFETY

In response to the Parish Councils Road Safety Survey results Brian Watkins the Local Highways Manager was invited to the meeting to discuss the views of the parishioners he advised that all the standard qualifying road safety work to this stretch of the A4136 was completed in 2012. He advised that a pedestrian crossing or similar scenario wouldn't meet GCC funding criteria because the pedestrian footfall is below levels required which are 100 crossings per hour. He went through the various possible suggestions as follows:

Reducing speed limit to 20mph through village - not possible no school etc Increasing 30mph range out from village towards Coleford - not possible Speed Cushions - very noisy for those living next to them especially with use of heavy lorries so wouldn't be supported

Zebra Crossing - best place on the A4136 would be between the pub and Well Meadow but the road shape doesn't help with visibility, lack of footfall and very expensive (approx. £60,000 would have to be funded by village).

Pavement to continue between the church and corner of Well Meadow - difficult because it would have to encroach on a local persons' land (approx. £40,000)

Slow Down permanent solar panel sign £7500-10,000 would last approx. 10 years Increase repeater 30mph through village - village has required number of street lights should signal to the driver it is 30mph

Action:

Brian Watkins to provide a list of possible traffic calming solutions with potential costings

Brian Watkins to provide cost to erect a 'Gateway' to the village solution at Coleford end. Brian Watkins to investigate whether rumble strips can be refreshed and whether count down speed limit markers can be added from the Monmouth approach

Brian Watkins to look at painting large 30 markers on the A4136 through village.

Clerk to contact Police and Crime Commissioner regarding the availability of ASB and Road Safety Funding and Councillor Allaway-Martin regarding discretionary pot of funding from the quarry.

Clerk to rebook Road Safety cameras for 2 week period in March 2019 (cancelled from Jan 2019 due to lack of volunteers).

Clerk to rebook Road Safety camera training with Coleford Police Station.

Brian Watkins to look into clearing the path between the hot dog van and the end of the wood on the LHS of A4136 heading out of the village towards Coleford.

John Richards to circulate invitation to speed gun training to friends of the church

It was resolved to delay setting up the new Management Committee till June after the reelection of the Parish Council Councillors in May 2019. JS updated Council about the current situation regarding funding and explained that Natural England will be providing 1 further year of funding until 2020 and this will be reviewed on a yearly basis. Action: JS to speak to Chris at Natural England to confirm the pony grazing regime for 2019/2020

JS and JH to discuss the stipulations with the Horse Management Contractor Clerk to draft a letter to Horse Management Contractor to confirm outcome JS to speak to Chris at Natural England to see if there is a funding for a Conservation Consultant to work with Council on a 10 year plan. Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust could potentially provide this service.

A note was circulated by FS from Gigaclear regarding the Fastershire High Speed internet cable as follows;

"I can confirm after investigation, the route for the network is currently in the design process. At the moment we do have a forecasted date for the beginning of the build of July 2020, however I do need to advise that this is subject to change. Please be assured that the residents of the community will be advised of when the build will begin".
