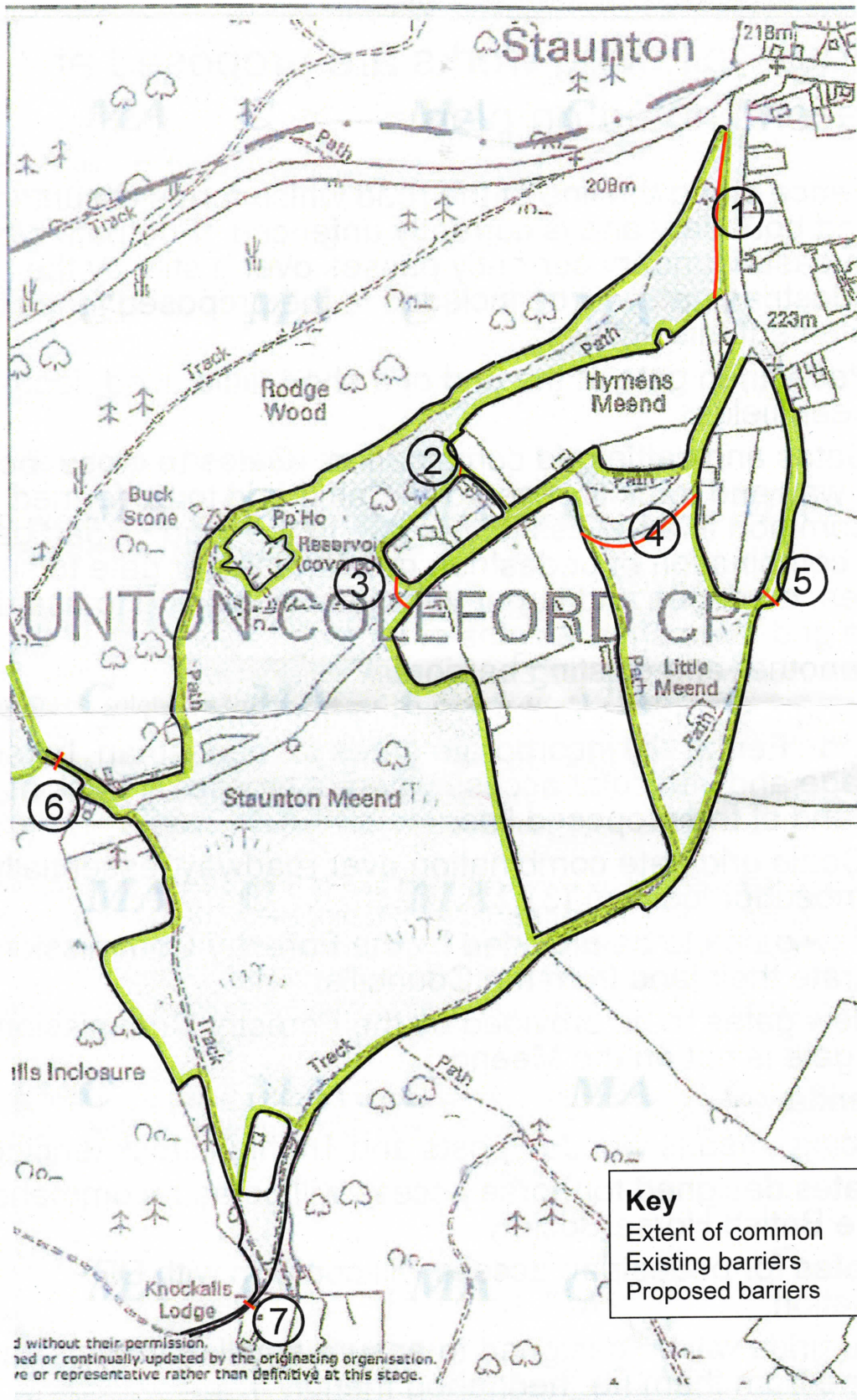

Notes – following works are proposed at locations noted on plan

- (1) Fence along the line of the road which forms Staunton Meend boundary and is currently unfenced. Footpath along north east boundary currently passes over a stile by the road. A pedestrian gate will be included in the proposed fence to supplement this access.
- (2) Pedestrian gate at the end of a short, little used, footpath between fields.
- (3) Gates and cattle grid combination. Gates to cross both road way and track to reservoir. Cattle grid to be formed on the common in a bypass to the gate to the road. Road gate to be a combination of pedestrian gate and larger gate to suit horses, carriages and larger vehicles not wishing to use the cattle grid. Also short lengths of fencing to connect all these to one another and existing barriers
- (4) Length of fencing to the south of the roadway across the Meend. Fence will incorporate gates for pedestrian, horse, carriage and vehicular access where it crosses a track at the east end of the proposed line.
- (5) Cattle grid/gate combination over roadway, essentially as described for location (3).
- (6) New gates to be provided by the Forestry Commission separate their land from the Council's.
- (7) New gates to be provided by the Forestry Commission. This gate is not on the Meend
- Addenda:
 - "Fencing" means wooden posts and 1m high stock fencing
 - All gates designed for horse access will be as recommended by the British Horse Society.
 - All gates for pedestrian access will conform with DDA legislation.
 - Cattle grids will be designed to ensure small mammals can escape from them (ie "hedgehog friendly")
