3079.1 VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGNS

3079.3 COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH FUND

It was reported that GCC had launched a £600,000 fund (details previously circulated) and that should the application for the VASs fail, this could be an alternative funding source for them.

3080 STAUNTON MEEND

3080.1 HLS SCHEME EXTENSION

It was reported that the application for the two year extension of the scheme had been submitted but that there had been no confirmation it had been accepted.

3080.2 HLS 2021 PAYMENT

It was reported that correspondence with the RPA had continued to try and recover the 2021 grant. Despite a promise by the officer to talk through the appeal process, only more paperwork had been sent. The appeal form had been completed and a decision was awaited.

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3080.3 LAND AGENT

It was reported that an initial enquiry had been made of Carver Knowles (Land Agents). The Clerk had spoken to the firm who agreed to a site / exploratory visit on a date to be agreed.

3080.4 JAMIE'S FARM

It was reported that there had been no further contact and that until the result of the planning application was known the future was uncertain.

3081 OTHER PARISH LAND

3081.1 TREE WORK

The advice of the Tree Officer re the Beech tree opposite the church was discussed and it was agreed that the tree crown should be reduced; Clerk to obtain new quote for the work.

3081.2 ASH TREE

It was reported that planning application to fell the 6 Ash trees had been submitted (see 3077.1.1 above). The Clerk had advised, in answer to a query from FODDC, that there was no intention to plant replacements as the area was already well wooded.

3081.3 PUBLIC CONTRIBUTION TO COST OF FELLING ASH TREES

The contribution offered by Mr M G Davis was gratefully accepted.

3081.4 BRAMBLES AT THE POUND

The advice from Nick Sargent to control the brambles was discussed. It was agreed that this would be dealt with 'in house' with vegetation rooted in the wall being chemically treated and the remainder kept cut down.

3081.5 SAFETY MEASURE - THE FROGSMOUTH

It was agreed to obtain quotes **(CIIr Richards)** to install a post and rail fence from the end of the existing metal fence alongside Rookery Lane, as far as the gate/fence. A suitable sign would be placed on the fence to deter anyone from accessing the land behind which leads to the Frogsmouth.

3082 MILLENNIUM PROJECT - VILLAGE PUMP

It was agreed to obtain quotes for an interpretation board to be placed adjacent to the pump. (Cllr Woodhouse)

3083 QUEENS PLATINUM JUBILEE

It was confirmed the plan is to plant around 20 trees in the autumn; species to be agreed – perhaps fruit trees. Advice to be sought from Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust **(CIIr Astley)**, perhaps a plaque with the childrens' first name and maybe a social event at the planting. Consideration to be given to access for adjacent hedge cutting.
